



Mrs. Mamie Ruth Davis

January 3, 1949 - September 21, 2025

Mamie Ruth Woodson Davis, 76, passed away peacefully on September 21, 2025, in Houston, Texas. She was born on January 3, 1949, in LaGrange, Texas, to the late Joe Edward and Ruth Cook (McKenzie) Woodson.

Mamie, affectionately called "Sista Baby," was raised in a loving home as the baby of the family and the only girl — a role that shaped her nurturing and caring spirit throughout her life. She was a proud graduate of LaGrange High School, Class of 1967, and Huston-Tillotson University, Class of 1971. She went on to earn a Deaf and Hard of Hearing Certification from the University of Texas and later achieved her Master's degree from Prairie View A&M University in 1984.

She dedicated her life to education and to advocating for children. Mamie began her education career at Austin State School, working with adults with developmental disabilities. After getting married and moving to Houston, she continued her career with Houston Independent School District at Stephen F. Austin, Mirabeau B. Lamar, and Barbara Jordan High School. After 33 years of service, she re-tired, remembered as a fierce advocate for her students and a passionate believer in the power of education to transform lives.

A dedicated member of Trinity East United Methodist Church, Mamie served faithfully in many capacities. She also remained devoted to her alma mater, leading the Houston Chapter of Huston-Tillotson Alumni Association as President and serving in numerous roles throughout the years.

Mamie was known for her impeccable style - always fashionable and classy -

her infectious smile as well as her love of sports. Whether cheering for one of her favorite teams or sharing the excitement of a big game, she enjoyed the energy and camaraderie that sports brought into her life. She also had a gift for cooking, and family and friends will forever treasure the meals and memories she created around the table. In addition to her professional and community contributions, Mamie embraced life's pleasures: she loved traveling with her daughter and cherished special "girls' getaways" with her best friends.
